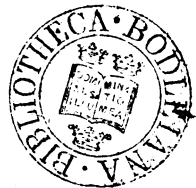

COUNTY DECLARATION.

At a highly respectable Meeting of Freeholders, who disapproved any interference on their part, respecting the late transactions at Manchester, assembled at Jewel's Hotel in Bodmin, on Monday Nov. 8th, 1819, the Right Honourable the Earl of Saint GERMANs in the Chair, the following Declaration was moved by the Right Honourable Lord DE DUNSTANVILLE, seconded by the Right Honourable Viscount FALMOUTH; and being carried by acclamation, was signed by 119 Freeholders then present, and was then ordered to be circulated throughout the County to obtain further Signatures.

DECLARATION.

It appearing that a Requisition for a County Meeting has been actually made to the High Sheriff, "for the purpose of considering what measures it may be necessary to pursue, in order that such an inquiry may be instituted into the late Transactions at Manchester as shall satisfy the ends of Justice, and appease the irritated feelings of the People."

DECLARATION.

And the Sheriff having, much to his honour, declined to comply with such Requisition : We the Undersigned Freeholders, and We the Undersigned Inhabitants, feel ourselves called upon to express our cordial satisfaction at such refusal, to applaud the manliness and discretion with which it has been made, and to declare our decided disapprobation of, and dissent from any such measure as proposed by that Requisition.

We consider it as unconstitutional and dangerous to call upon the People at large to take any measures, the tendency of which is to interfere with the regular course of Justice, and to influence the decisions of the legal Tribunals of the Country.

We cannot but observe the palpable inconsistency of asserting that his Majesty's Ministers have prejudged the great question at issue, without the possibility of knowing the grounds or facts upon which they have acted ; and we confidently ask, if this assertion does not directly prejudge his Majesty's Ministers?

We ask also, with what semblance of fairness or justice we could pretend, at a County Meeting in Cornwall, to resolve without evidence, that the conduct of the Coroner at Oldham has

been in any respect improper? We must and we do lament the consequences which have attended the Meeting at Manchester on the 16th of August; but we should be insensible of the great blessings of our invaluable Constitution, if we were not convinced that Justice is open to all his Majesty's subjects. In the pure, unsullied character of our Judges, in the integrity of our Juries, we feel the most perfect confidence; and we are sure that redress is open to all who may have just cause of complaint, without any extraneous interference. We deprecate, therefore, in the strongest manner, such proceedings, as likely to be subversive of the ends of Justice, as tending in an alarming degree to encourage the disaffected, to spread and confirm the delusions, and thereby increase the irritation of that portion of the People which they propose to appease.

And at a moment so fraught with alarm and danger as the present, we deem it necessary to add that, convinced that we do enjoy greater blessings under his Majesty's paternal and constitutional government, than have ever fallen to the lot of any other Nation, we are firmly resolved to defend to the utmost of our power, against every attack which may be made upon it, that Constitution in Church and State from which those blessings are derived.
