the said Right Reverend Father, or his certain Attorney, Successor, or Assigns;
To which Payment well and truly to be made, I bind myself, my Executors and
Administrators, firmly by these Presents. Sealed with my Seal. Dated the sixth

Day of *September* in the Year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty *twenty-two*.

THE Condition of this Obligation is such, That if hereafter there shall not appear any
Let or Impediment, by Reason of any former Marriage, Consanguinity, Affinity, or any
other lawful Cause whatsoever; but that *The aforesaid Harrison*
Procter Bachelor and Fanny Hall
of Barnard Castle aforesaid Spinster

may lawfully solemnize Marriage together, and in the same afterwards lawfully remain
and continue for Man and Wife, according to the Laws in that behalf provided: And
moreover, if there be not at this present Time any Action, Suit, Plaint, Quarrel, or De-
mand, moved or depending before any Judge Ecclesiastical or Temporal, for or concern-
ing any such lawful Impediment between the said Parties; nor that either of them be of
any other Place, or of better Estate or Degree, than to the Judge at granting of this
Licence is suggested; and if such Consent as is required by Law to the said Marriage
hath been given; and if the same Marriage shall be openly solemnized in the Church or
Chapel in the Licence specified, between the hours appointed in the Constitutions eccle-
siastically confirmed, and according to the Form of the Book of Common Prayer, now
by Law established; and, lastly, if the said *Harrison Procter*

do save harmless and indemnify the above-mentioned Right Reverend Father in God, his
Vicar-General, and his Surrogates, and all other his Officers whatsoever, by Reason of
the Premises; then this Obligation to be void, or else to remain in full Force and Virtue.

SHUTE, by Divine Providence, Lord Bishop of Durham : To our well-beloved in Christ *Harrison Procter*
of *Barnard Castle* in the Parochial Chapelry of *Barnard*
Castle in the County and Diocese of *Durham* Bachelor
and *Fanny Hall* of the same Place Parochial Chapelry
County and Diocese aforesaid Spinster.

WHEREAS ye are, as is alleged, desirous to proceed to the Solemnization of true and lawful Matrimony ; And Whereas ye are
respectively of the full age of twenty one years

And the same hath been fully proved, as required by the Act passed in the third year of the reign of his present Majesty, Chapter
seventy-five. We being willing that such your honest intentions may the more speedily attain their due Effect, for certain just Causes,
us thereunto moving, do by these presents grant our Faculty and Licence, as well to you the parties contracting, as to the Minister of the
Chapel and Chapelry of Barnard Castle
aforesaid, and to all others who shall be then and there present, that without Publication or Proclamation of Banns, you may warrantably
and freely cause the said Marriage to be solemnized by the Minister aforesaid, according to the form of Solemnization of Matrimony
described by the Book of Common Prayer, and Administration of the Sacraments, and other Rites and Ceremonies of the Church, ac-
cording to the use of the Church of England, established by Act of Parliament : PROVIDED, that there be no let or impediment, by
reason of any Precontract, Consanguinity, Affinity, or any other lawful cause whatsoever, to hinder your intended Marriage ; and that the
said Marriage be so solemnized in the face of the Congregation in the *Chapel of Barnard Castle*

aforesaid, between the hours of eight and twelve in the forenoon. And PROVIDED ALWAYS, that if any fraud hereafter appear, either by rea-
son of the truth suppressed, or falsehood suggested, at the time of obtaining this Licence, that the said Licence be void to all intents and
purposes in law, as if the same had never been granted ; and in that case we enjoin all Ministers, if any of the premises shall become
known unto them, that they proceed not in any wise to solemnize the said Marriage, without having first consulted us touching the same.

in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty *two*.
